For an additional amount for "Military Construction, Air Force", \$93,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2021: *Provided, such funds may be obligated and expended to carry out planning and design and military construction projects authorized by law.*

This request will be used to complete three FY 2016 projects with funding shortfalls and to plan and design military construction projects that support warfighting readiness and new mission beddowns. Two of the FY 2016 projects with funding shortfalls support the Basic Military Training (BMT) campuses located at Joint Base San Antonio, Texas by constructing a Recruit Dormitory and a Classroom/Dining Facility. The third FY 2016 project will construct a new Weapons Storage Facility located at F.E. Warren AFB, Wyoming.

Without additional funding to address project shortfalls, the BMT will be unable to provide sufficient support to a growing force structure and the current weapon storage facilities will remain deficient in meeting critical security requirements and will continue to degrade, negatively impacting weapons maintenance activities. Without additional planning and design, funding will be insufficient to design projects in the FY 2018 and FY 2019 Military Construction Program and complex technical projects with long lead-times will be significantly delayed.

<u>Project description</u>: This is the ninth project in an overhaul of Basic Military Training (BMT) campuses with an original programmed amount of \$35 million. This project provides the third of four satellite dining hall/classroom buildings in the Recruit Housing and Training facility replacement program. The ground floor will consist of a serving area, a kitchen, and a dining area. This project provides laundry pickup and minor clinic support areas. The second and third floors will consist of classrooms. Pavements include parking and a delivery road.

<u>Justification</u>: The cost increase is due to higher than expected costs. The previous two Classroom/Dining Facilities were in line with their programmed amount. The 100% design cost estimate for this project is equal to the total cost above. The \$10 million shortfall is due to cost increases in the overall construction market and shortage of skilled labor resources in the area.

<u>Project description</u>: This is the eighth project in an overhaul of the Basic Military Training (BMT) campuses with an original programmed amount of \$71 million. This project constructs the fifth Recruit Dormitory including administrative support, open-bay dormitories, central latrines, drill pad and running track, weapons cleaning pavilion, physical training areas, storage, and a semi-improved construction access road.

<u>Justification</u>: The cost increase is due to higher than expected costs. The cost of the previous four dormitories were in line with their programmed amount. When the fifth was sent out for bids, the low bid came back at greater than 125% of the programmed amount. The \$20 million shortfall is due to cost increases in the overall construction market and shortage of skilled labor resources that were unforeseen at the time of programming/appropriation.

<u>Project description</u>: This project constructs a new Weapon Storage Facility including administrative support, maintenance, training areas, and storage. The current facilities do not meet several of the security requirements mandated in DoD security directives. The aging infrastructure requires workarounds to meet mission requirements and the current facilities and systems are inadequate to support ongoing weapons maintenance activities. Current work-arounds do not address multiple security deviations nor can they realistically address all of the known requirements.

<u>Justification</u>: The large estimate growth is predominantly attributable to an evolving understanding of facility security requirements. As the design progressed, Air Force security experts provided U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the architectural and engineering firm with more information regarding specific facility security features, which in a number of instances added significant cost to the project. Most notably, the estimated cost for required forced entry doors rose sharply when U.S. Army Corps of Engineers received cost estimates from door constructors who had been given the opportunity to review the door design. In addition to cost growth related to facility security features, \$8 million of Current Working Estimate increase is attributable to late realization that earlier cost estimates had used standard Davis-Bacon labor rates as opposed higher and more appropriate regional labor rates.

This proposal will provide funding for planning and design of Fiscal Year 2018 European Reassurance Initiative military construction projects that implement the United States European Command's European Contingency Air Operations Sets plan and increase Combat Air Force Presence at both existing enduring locations and at new locations where the Department of Defense does not currently have military presence.

SEC. XXX. Of the unobligated balances made available by division I of Public Law 113-235 for "European Reassurance Initiative Military Construction" for "Military Construction, Air Force", \$12,300,000 is hereby permanently cancelled: Provided, That such amounts are designated by the Congress for Overseas Contingency Operations/Global War on Terrorism pursuant to section 251(b)(2)(A)(ii) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended.

This FY 2015 rescission will finance the planning and design of Fiscal Year 2018 European Reassurance Initiative military construction projects that implement the United States European Command's European Contingency Air Operations Sets plan and increase Combat Air Force presence at both existing enduring locations and at new locations where the Department of Defense does not currently have military presence.
