INTRODUCTION

The National Guard Personnel, Air Force appropriation provides the required funding to ensure accomplishment of the Air National Guard (ANG) mission; to provide trained units to selectively augment the Active Force. The FY 1998/1999 Biennial Budget Estimate Submission is based on an average strength of 109,239 Guard Members in FY 1997, 106,548 in FY 1998, and 105,966 in FY 1999 who will be assigned to ANG flying and mission support units. In addition to annual 15-day tours and 48 drill periods; tours of active duty will provide training for selected ANG personnel. Included in the above average strengths are 10,294 full-time active duty ANG personnel in FY 1997, with 10,450 and 10660 in FY 1998 and FY 1999 respectively.

As the force drawdown continues, the ANG decreases end strength by 1,306 in FY 1997. Our budget request increases for approved price growth projections. Force reductions in fighter aircraft and completion of prior year drawdowns are offset by program growth of various missions that have transferred from active Air Force to the Air National Guard.

Our budget also reflects a reimbursable program to support the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) program of F-16 training of foreign pilots and the National Science Foundation (NSF) Antarctic mission that transferred in FY 1996 from the Navy to the Air National Guard. Reimbursable average strengths are 1,053 in FY 1997, and 1,117 in FY 1998 and FY 1999 respectively.

This budget request represents the minimum level of funding required to accomplish the Air National Guard share of the National Defense mission. With the resources requested the ANG will provide nearly 32% of the total Air Force flying combat capability, ranging from 100% of the interceptor and reconnaissance capability, to 9% of the strategic airlift capability. Further, the ANG will provide significant non-flying mission support capability in areas such as combat communications and engineering installation.

The Air National Guard serves proudly and validates the credibility of our training programs. As the force is restructured, the Air National Guard continues to accept new and increased National Defense challenges. We have been very successful in accepting these challenges in the past, and can continue to do so with full funding of this request.

The following are the economic assumptions employed in pricing the approved programs. Social Security costs are based on the percentage rate set by law on a member's salary for a calendar year. P.L. 98-21, "Social Security Amendment of 1983 "dated 20 April 1983 established the tax rate while the maximum taxable income is determined by the Social Security Administration. The Old Age, Survivor, and Disability Insurance (OASDI) rate is 6.2% and the Hospital Insurance (HI) is 1.45%. There is no wage cap on the 1.45 percent medical contribution. The Government's contribution is based on the percentage rate set by law on member's salary for a calendar year. Taxable income ceilings for CASDI are as follows.



PART II - JUSTIFICATION OF FUNDS REQUESTED

All individuals enlisting, reenlisting, or extending for not less than six years in the Selected Reserve after 1 July, 1985, except those who have received a commission from a service academy or completed an ROTC scholarship program, are eligible to receive educational assistance unless they are entitled for assistance under Chapter 30 of Title 38 U.S.C. The individuals must also meet initial training and high school diploma or equivalency requirements. Cost estimates are actuarially based and reflect eligibility estimates adjusted by an estimate of ultimate benefit utilization and partially offset by an estimate of interest earned on investments of the Education Benefits Fund. The program will provide funds adequate to allow for one of three levels of assistance. These levels are \$140.00 per month for full-time educational pursuit, \$105.00 for three quarter time pursuit and \$70.00 for half time pursuit. The maximum total benefit that can be paid is \$5,040.00.

High cost areas are grouped as Military Housing Areas (MHA) where the cost of food and services exceeds 109 percent of the national cost of living average. Computation of program cost is the product of military members by grade and dependency status, the number of members assigned to the designated high-cost area of CONUS, and the percent by which an area's cost of non-housing goods and services exceeds 109 percent of the national cost of living average
